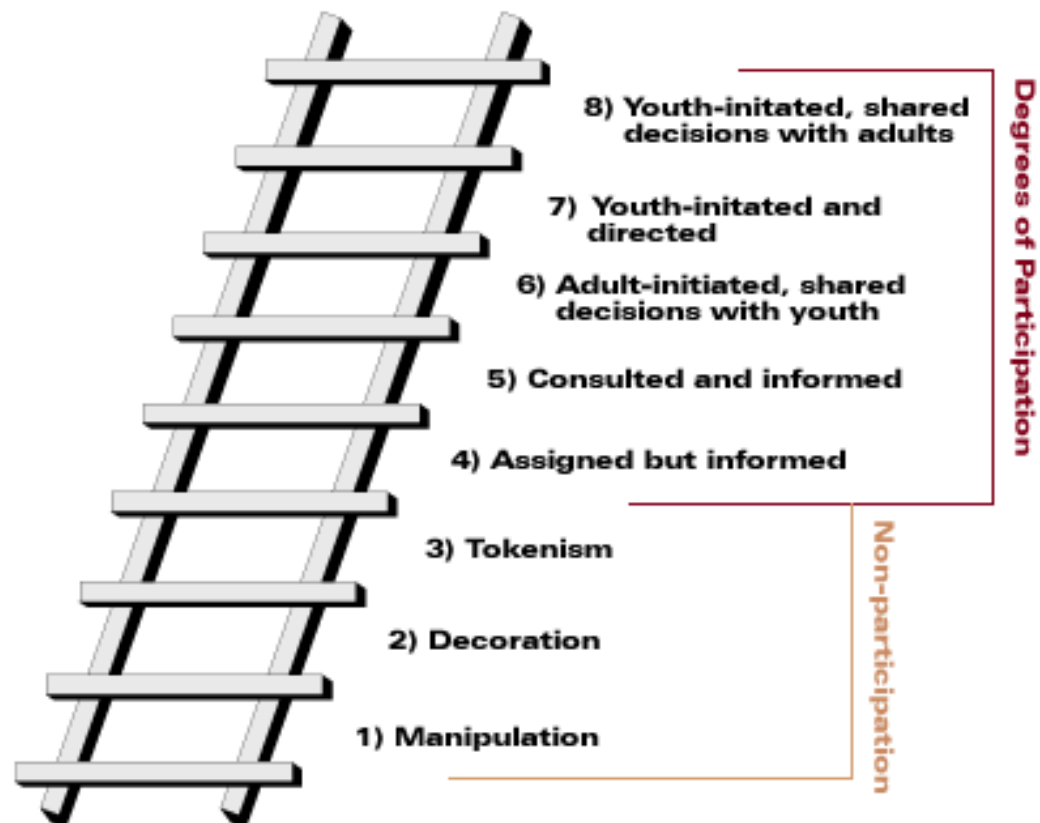
Youth Participation

- What is *meaningfully involved*?



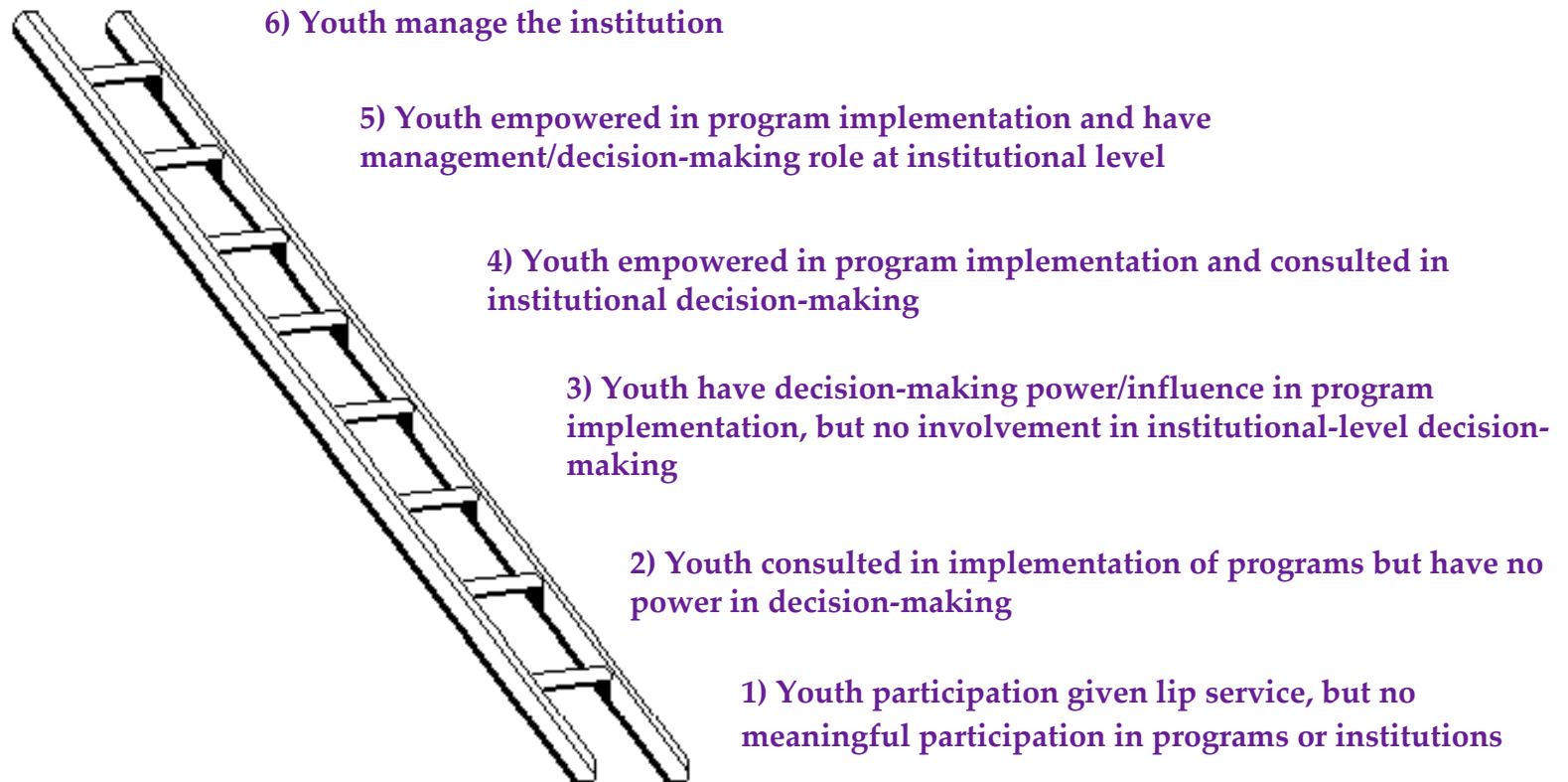


Hart's Ladder of Youth Participation





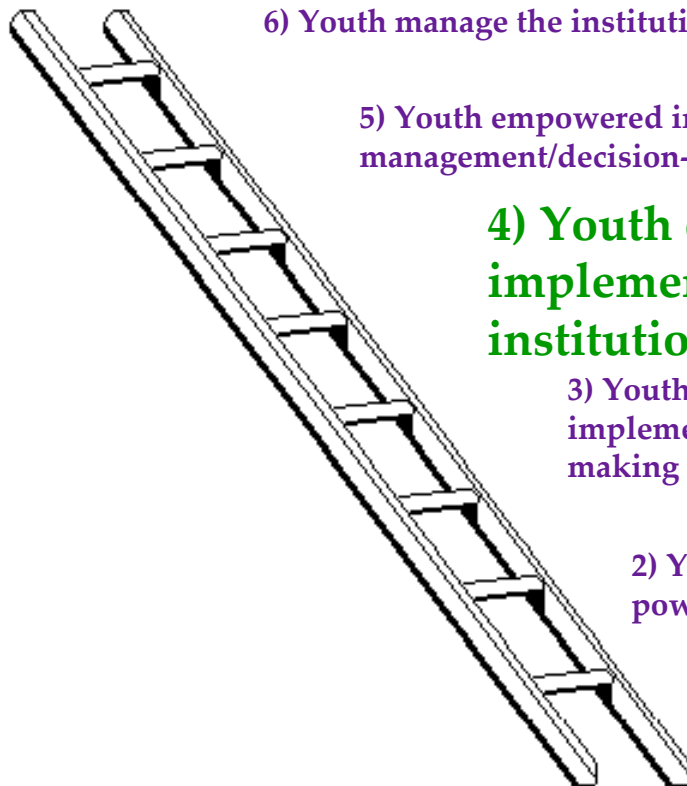
Hally's Ladder of Youth Participation

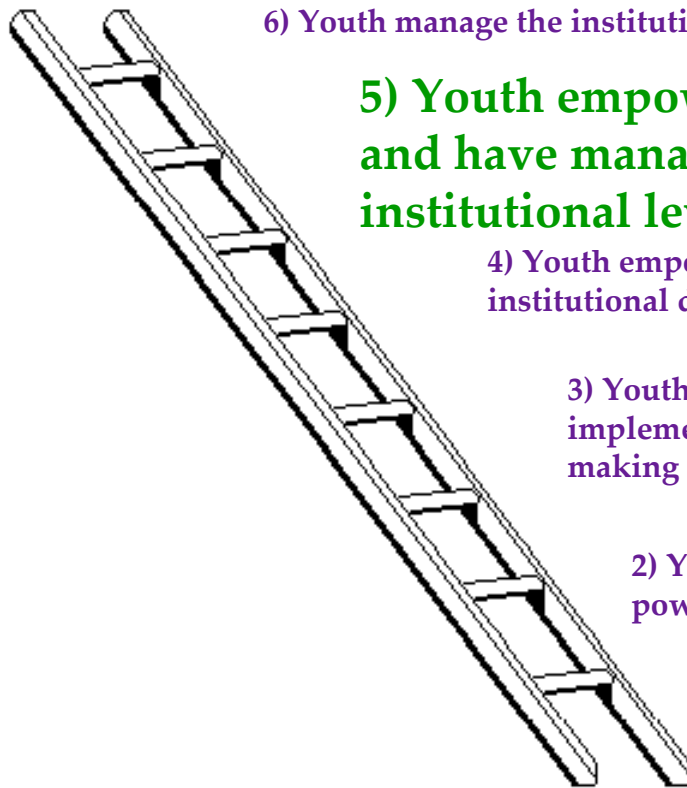

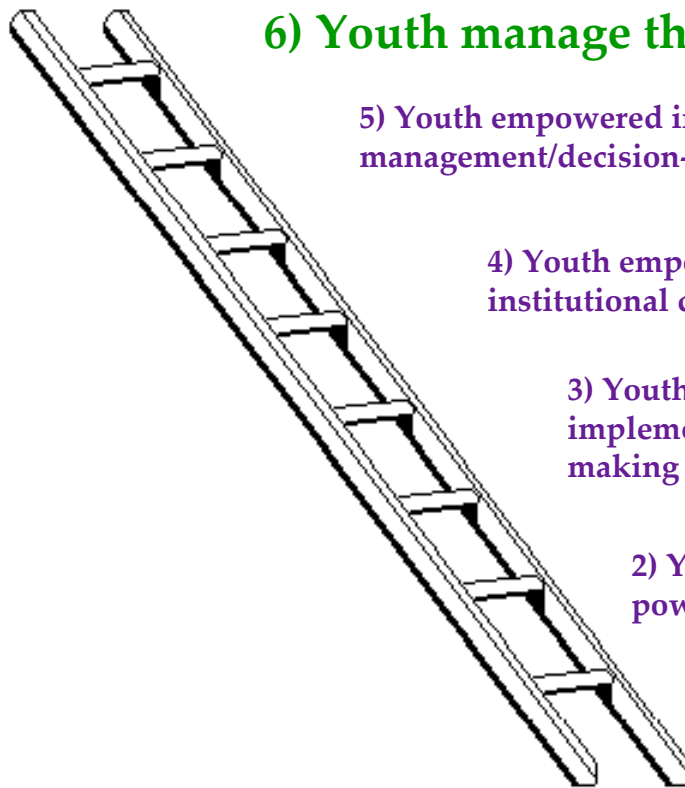

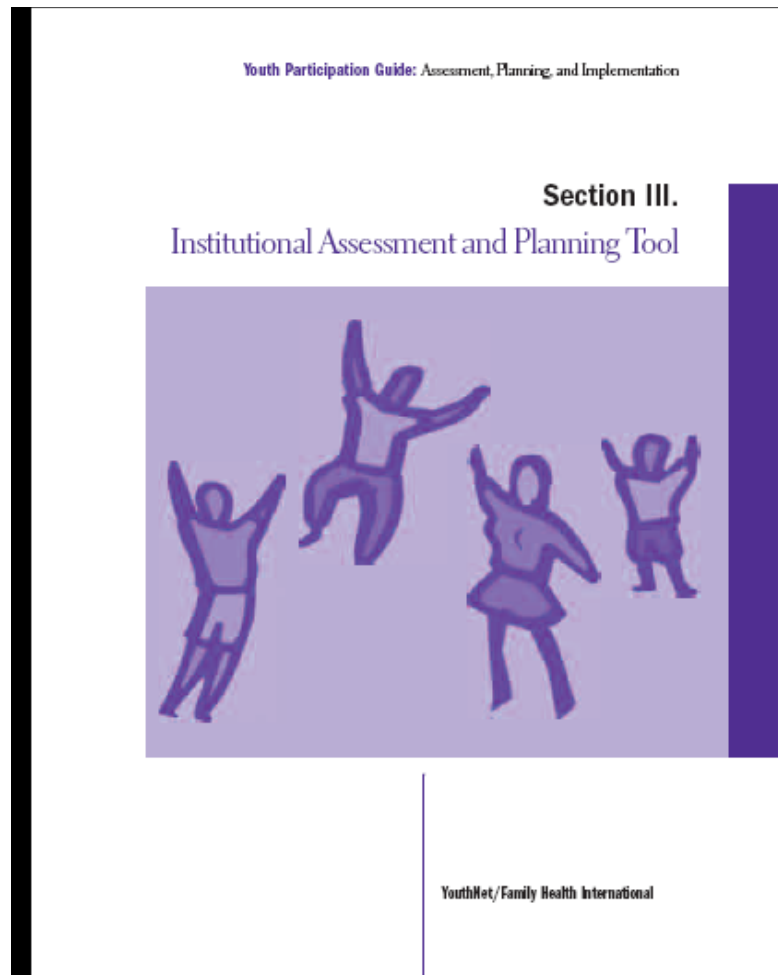
